Part-time instructor positions available for science courses offered to academically gifted students in middle and high school through *CTY Online*, the Johns Hopkins University Center for Talented Youth's Distance Education Program.

General Description: Position involves teaching individually-paced, distance education science courses to gifted students. Course content is provided via web-based materials, so developing lectures is not necessary, but initiative in developing new course materials is encouraged and expected. Instructor is responsible for facilitating student learning; facilitating the development of academic skills; engaging and encouraging students; assisting students with course content; stimulating an interest in science beyond the scope of course materials; tracking student progress; conducting assessments; providing feedback; suggesting resources for further study; revising existing course materials and developing new course materials; communicating regularly with students, parents, and colleagues; and working closely with program administrators on course-related issues to ensure an outstanding educational experience for every student.

This is a part-time (minimum 10 hours/week - maximum 20 hours/week) position without benefits. Scheduling is very flexible; work can be done in the evenings and on weekends. Pay begins at \$16/hour and increases with education and experience.

Qualifications: Bachelor's degree in science and strong science background required; advanced degree preferred. Teaching experience required; familiarity with distance education technologies a plus. Excellent communication skills and very strong organizational skills necessary.
